## DO NOT BE A TARGET OF HEALTHCARE FRAUD

Mr. Lee has Medicare. One evening he received a phone call from a woman who identified herself as a Medicare representative. The woman told Mr. Lee she could save him hundreds of dollars each month by signing him up for new Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage. Mr. Lee pays over \$300 in drug costs each month, so he was eager to join. When the woman said she could sign him up over the phone and asked for his Medicare and checking account numbers, he gave them to her.

After sleeping on it, Mr. Lee realized he had made a mistake by giving out his personal information and contact-



ed his local Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP). The SMP helped Mr. Lee contact his bank to close his account and reported the crime to the police and Medicare.

You can reach the *Missouri SMP* by calling the toll-free hotline **1-888-515-6565**. Its mission is to empower and assist Medicare beneficiaries to prevent, detect, and report healthcare errors, fraud, and abuse through outreach, counseling, and education.
