LASM TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE ... APPLY FOR THE SENIOR **PROPERTY TAX FREEZE**

Issue 4

The City of St. Louis has enacted a Senior Citizen Property Tax Freeze Credit program, which provides seniors with fixed City real estate property tax rates. Eligible seniors may apply for the credit annually through the City of St. Louis Assessor's Office.

Eligibility requirements include:

- 62 years of age by Sept. 1, 2024.
- **Obtained 40 Social Security** retirement benefit credits
- Own and physically occupy the primary residence located in the City of St. Louis
- Appraised market value of property is \$500,000 or less
- Property taxes from the previous year are paid in full.

If you would like assistance filing the application, LASM is here to help! On Wednesday, April 17th from 10:00 am until Noon you can make a 15-minute appointment with an LASM staff member or volunteer to apply for the freeze.
