6401 Scanlan.




Free admission, donations of nonperishable food items will be collected

ENERGYCARE SERVICES

E nergyCare is a nonprofit organization established in 1983 with the mission of providing energy assistance and services to low-income residents of St. Louis City and County who are elderly, have chronic illness or disability, or have young children in the home. Winter assistance includes free blankets, electric blankets, and space heaters to those in need.



Trained volunteers are available for in-home evaluations as well as free basic weatherization services, i.e., applying vinyl and caulking to windows, weather stripping doors. "Do It Yourself" home weatheriza-

tion kits can be obtained free of charge. Education on energy efficiency and utility utilization is also offered. Limited assistance with payment of utility bills may be available.
