FROM OUR CASE MANAGER

QUESTION: I have been thinking about who would make my healthcare and financial decisions if I were no longer able to manage my own affairs. I really don't have a relative or friend willing to serve as my agent for Power of Attorney. What can I do?

ANSWER: Guardian Assist is a nonprofit that was created by a group of caring professionals seeking to protect vulnerable people from harm and victimization by providing options, services, and education about supported decision making. Their mission is to provide individualized, compassionate, and dignified health care and financial decision making services as Guardians, Conservators and Agents appointed as Powers of Attorney to adults in need.

Guardian Assist has very qualified social workers, attorneys, and money managers who specialize in this area of practice, and serve as educators, facilitators, and advocates for the public. Their team members follow the National Guardianship Association Standards.
