

## EXTRA HELP FOR MEDICARE PART B

People with low incomes can participate in programs through the Missouri Department of Senior Services that reduce or even eliminate



Medicare Part B premiums, deductibles, and/or co-payments. The income limit is currently \$1,366 per month for a single person and \$1,852 per month for a married couple.

## APPLY FOR THE MISSOURI PROPERTY TAX CREDIT

The Missouri Property Tax Credit Claim (known as "Circuit Breaker") gives credit to certain senior citizens and 100 percent disabled individuals for a portion of the real estate taxes or rent they have paid for the year. The credit is for a maximum of \$750 for renters and \$1,100 for owners who owned and occupied their home. The actual credit is based on the amount of real estate taxes or rent paid and total household income.

In order to qualify:

- As a homeowner, your TOTAL household income is below \$30,000 for a single person or \$34,000 for a married couple.
- As a renter, your TOTAL household income is less than \$27,500 for a single person or \$29,500 for a married couple.
- You or your spouse must be 65 or over as of December 31, 2018; OR you or your spouse must be 100% disabled as a result of military service, regardless of age; OR you or your spouse must be a disabled person; OR you must be a surviving spouse at least age 60 receiving Social Security benefits.
- You must have paid property tax on or rented the homestead you occupied during 2018. This also includes a room in a nursing home or an apartment.
- You DO NOT rent from a non-profit organization.

If you are in need of assistance filing, contact the LASM Office at 647-4591. In addition to the director, LASM is pleased to have an AARP-trained volunteer to assist with filing taxes this year.
