# 2022: A YEAR END REVIEW

This time of year lends itself to reflecting on the past and looking toward the future, both important practices. As we embark on the New Year, Lindenwood Area Senior Ministry would like to share some of its 2022 highlights in numbers!

- LASM celebrated its 16<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of ministry for, to and by seniors!
- 25 LASM Transportation Ministers provided 99 round-trip rides to medical appointments for 40 registered participants.
- 17 Saturday Servant volunteers + volunteers from several service groups completed 138 home maintenance/repair projects among 85 registered households.
- A 1<sup>st</sup> time Swing into Summer outdoor concert was held.
- 37 older adults reached out for resources and/or engaged in ongoing case management services via our expanding Case Management Program.
- A Lenten Walk to Jerusalem program logged 7,371 miles by its 73 participants.
- 15 tables of attendees helped our 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Trivia Night return to in-person with a bang!



- 24 social and educational programs offered a variety of opportunities such as day trips, musical entertainment, health/wellness presentations.
- 10 Stephen Ministers provided 1:1 weekly caring visits. 3 new Stephen Ministers were trained and will be Commissioned on January 8<sup>th</sup>!
- 700+ individuals received monthly newsletters full of LASM

news and community resources.

• Team of **60**+ volunteers gave countless hours to allow all the above to happen!

# 2023 BUDGET REPORT

O ur ministry's annual budget is funded through the generous support of our partner churches, individual donors, fundraising efforts and grants from the Lutheran Foundation of St. Louis and the Charless Foundation. Our 2023 budget was recently approved by LASM's Board of Directors. Below is a narrative report of our ministry's budgeted expenses for 2023:

### Payroll: \$58,370

The part-time Director's salary for the coordination, supervision, and implementation of the ministry's programs and services. The part-time Case Manager's salary for providing case management services, community networking and navigation of community resources. A cell phone and mileage stipend for the Director and Case Manager. Contract compensation for the ministry's newsletter editor, guest speakers/entertainers, graphic designer and website/social media consultant.
