2023: A YEAR END REVIEW

Giving thanks for all that 2023 held for Lindenwood Area Senior Ministry! An overview in numbers...

LASM celebrated its **17**th Anniversary of ministry for, to and by seniors!

27 LASM Transportation Ministers provided **67** round-trip rides to medical appointments for 37 registered participants.

2 new coordinators were recruited to organize rides for the Transportation Ministry.

15 Saturday Servant volunteers + several service groups completed 152 home maintenance/repair projects among 85 registered households.

20 older adults received ongoing case management services and many more received one-time referrals for community resources or personalized insurance reviews.

120 attended spring Jukebox Jamboree fundraiser and raised more than **\$3,000** in support of the ministry.

A Lenten Walk to Jerusalem program logged **8,500** miles by its **68** participants.

10 group walks were held at Lindenwood Park in the spring and fall.

23 tables of attendees played at our 12th

Annual Trivia Night and raised **\$7,000**+ for LASM's programs and services.

14 social and educational programs were offered.

We embarked on 6 day trips!

8 individuals received weekly caring

visits via our Stephen Ministry program.

20 LASM seniors received Christmas care packages.

LASM partnered with Machacek Library to offer **three** 8-week Balance and Revitalize exercise classes.

700+ individuals received monthly newsletters full of LASM news and community resources.

2 seminary students participated in 40 hours of service learning/volunteering with LASM staff.

A team of **60**+ volunteers gave countless hours to allow all the above to happen!

LASM TRANSPORTATION MINISTRY

Did you know that LASM has a nonemergency medical transportation program? Volunteer drivers provide registered riders with rides to medical appointments (i.e. doctor visits, labs, therapy). You must be 60+, a member of an LASM partner church or live in the Lindenwood Park Neighborhood boundaries and be ambulatory to register.

2024 BUDGET REPORT

Our ministry's annual budget is funded through the generous support of our partner churches, grants, individual donors, and fundraising efforts. Our 2024 budget was recently approved by LASM's Board of Directors. We strive to be good stewards of our resources and transparent regarding how our resources are utilized. Below is a narrative report of our ministry's budgeted expenses for 2024:

Payroll: \$68,784

The part-time Executive Director's salary (30 hrs./week) for the coordination, supervision, and implementation of the ministry's programs and services. The part-time Case Manager's salary (20 hrs./week) for providing case management services, community networking and navigation of community resources.

Payroll Taxes: \$5,262

Contract Compensation: \$2,500

Contract compensation for website/social media consultant, graphic designer and guest speakers/presenters.

Insurance: \$4,000

Annual premiums for general liability, directors and officers, workers compensation and volunteer insurances.

Training/Professional Development: \$1,500 Funding for Director, Case Manager, Board Members and/or Key Volunteers to attend development workshops and seminars.

Volunteer Background Checks: \$456

Volunteer Appreciation: \$1,200

Legacy Fund Development: \$1,500

Office Rent & Utilities: \$5,520

Office space, phone lines, and internet.

Newsletter: \$2,140

Printing and postage for ministry's monthly newsletter.

Office Supplies: \$4,200

Supplies, website hosting, and Quick-Books.

Fundraiser/Event Costs: \$3,670
Refreshments, supplies for monthly pro-

Refreshments, supplies for monthly programs, spring/fall fundraiser expenses.

Total Expenses Budgeted for 2024: \$100,732
