### FROM OUR CASE MANAGER

**QUESTION:** Since I've been living on a fixed income, I've had trouble saving any money for emergency use or big repairs. Any ideas on what I can do?

ANSWER: We just learned about a program open to 55+ St. Louis city residents called the Senior Resiliency Fund. It is a savings match program offered by Lifewise STL for older adults who would like to save money for a savings goal of their choosing as well as build connections with peers in their community. The program includes two virtual meetings a month for an hour that cover a new topic each time. Participants can receive a 2:1 match at the end to save even more towards their savings goal. For example, Lifewise STL will double the dollar amount saved, up to \$200 (\$400 matched). Your maximum income can be \$25,760 annually or \$2147 monthly to be eligible. - Film and television programs with descriptive narration


