WTJ FINAL UPDATE



FROM OUR CASE MANAGER

QUESTION: Over the years, I have incurred significant credit card debt and I cannot seem to pull out of it, especially now that I'm on a fixed income. Is there anything I can do?

ANSWER: First of all, know that you are not alone. Debt is a national crisis and 62% of Americans carry credit card debt month to month. Whether you are dealing with the effects of inflation, experiencing a financial strain that comes from an unexpected emergency—or you just need help with money management—a certified credit counselor can help you make a plan to pay off your debt.

I recommend starting with the National Foundation for Credit Counseling (NFCC) which is a nonprofit organization that

turns no one away. The NFCC offers counselors who are consumer advocates. They have built a national network of similarly committed nonprofit member agencies, which offer the right programs and solutions to fulfill their mission of creating access to financial health for anyone who seeks it.

In one session by phone (or in person), an NFCC Certified Counselor will speak with you about your current circumstances and help create an actionable plan to tackle your debt. There are no loans or hidden fees. They maintain relationships with banks and creditors in order to negotiate payment terms, lower interest rates, eliminate late fees, and stop collection calls.
