CASE MANAGEMENT Q&A

QUESTION: Where can I get help with making the right Medicare Health and/ or Drug Plan Choice for 2020? I think I need some help in doing all of this.

ANSWER: You, a relative, or someone you trust can go on the internet, at www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan to compare the coverage you have now with all of the 2020 options available, and enroll in a new plan if you decide to make a change.

If you would feel more comfortable meeting with someone in person, please call Katie Weintraub, MSW, at 314-647-4591. She will be happy to do a plan comparison for you.

You can also get one-on-one help from the State Health Insurance Assistance Program in Missouri. They offer free unbiased counseling and assistance. They can help you in person by appointment or over the phone, compare plans, and even enroll you into a new one. The number to reach this program is 1-800-390-3330 and is



called CLAIM (Community Leaders Assisting the Insured of Missouri).

Or, you may call a customer service

rep at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) 24-hours a day/7 days a week to find out more about your coverage options. TTY users should call 1-877-325-0778.

Open enrollment ends December 7.
