id you know that September 22nd is National Falls Prevention Awareness Day? The goal of this day is to increase awareness of the dangers of falls and focus on injury prevention. LASM is recognizing this day by hosting a special workshop with physical therapist, Dr. Beth. She is a Board Certified Specialist in Geriatric Physical Therapy and received her Doctorate of Physical Therapy from Washington University.

If you've noticed you aren't as steady on your feet as you used to be, it's tempting to think that it's just a normal part of aging—but it's not! Learn how you can improve your balance and prevent falls, no matter your age!

FROM OUR CASE MANAGER

QUESTION: My hearing is getting worse. I know that hearing aids are very expensive. Do you have any advice?

ANSWER: The Center for Hearing & Speech is a non-profit organization that can be more affordable for individuals with limited incomes. They provide needbased financial assistance, ranging from partial to full funding. Currently, United Way has provided them with a grant specifically for St. Louis City residents. Some clients could be eligible for hearing aid assistance through Missouri Vocational Rehabilitation services. The Center for Hearing & Speech also

partners with Midwest BankCentre to provide a lowinterest loan for all who qualify.
